Key Stage Two SATs results 2015



Attainment Level 4 and Above

The Department for Education uses as a benchmark, the percentage of pupils attaining Level 4 (the broad, nationally-expected level for 11 year olds) or more by the end of Year 6 in reading, writing and maths (ie all three) . One measure which the Department for Education uses is the percentage of pupils attaining Level 4 (the broad, nationally-expected level for 11 year olds) or more by the end of Year 6 in reading, writing and maths (ie all three).

In 2015, 79% of our pupils attained Level 4 (or higher) in all three subjects. (National 80%)

It's also useful to think about the breakdown between the core subjects of Reading, Writing and Maths (also included is the assessment of Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling).

KS2 Progress

Many people would argue that progress is the most important measure as it truly reflects the quality of teaching and learning, regardless of pupils' starting points. Progress is typically measured from Year 2 (the end of Key Stage 1) to Year 6 (the end of Key Stage 2). Two levels progress is expected between Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, three levels progress is more than expected.
